A Day's Work Done For

LOVE DAR A Day's Work Done For Love



In true "Friend" tradition, we are asking you to make the Love Darg Appeal 2022 a resounding success. This week we want you to crochet a simple poncho.







MATERIALS

Double Knitting Yarn in a selection of colours; 4 mm crochet hook; 4 stitch markers (or alternatives).

TENSION

4 tr clusters and and 9 rows to 10 cm using DK yarn and 4 mm hook.

ABBREVIATIONS

ch – chain;

ch sp – chain sp;

dc – double crochet;

rep - repeat;

rnd - round;

st(s) - stitches;

sl-st - slip stitch;

tr – treble;

tr cluster – 3 tr in same st or ch sp as instructed.

Size: To fit a child aged 4-10 years (adjustable). This giant granny square makes a cosy and colourful poncho. The length can easily be adjusted by working more or fewer rounds. After two rounds to set up the neck

opening, the pattern continues using the same principle as a traditional granny square and can be made to any size.

TO MAKE

Note: Markers are used on the 3rd rnd only, remove each marker as you come to it.

With 4 mm hook, make 72 ch, join first and last sts to make a ring (be careful not to twist sts).

1st rnd – 1 ch (does not count as a st), 1 dc in each ch to end, join with sl st in top of first dc – 72 dc.

2nd rnd - 3 ch (counts as first tr), 1 tr in first and next dc, ★1ch, 1 tr in each of next 3 dc, rep from ★ to end, 1 ch, join with a sl st to top of beg 3 ch. Fasten off yarn - 72 tr, 24 ch sp.

Place markers in 6th, 12th, 18th and last ch sp.

3rd rnd – Join new colour yarn into any marked ch sp, [3 ch, 2 tr, 3 ch, 3 tr] in same ch sp, 1 ch, [3 tr in next ch sp,

1 ch] 5 times, ★[3 tr, 3 ch, 3 tr] in next ch sp, 1 ch, [3 tr in next ch sp, 1 ch] 5 times, rep from ★ 3 times, join with sl st to top of beg 3 ch and fasten off yarn.

4th rnd – Join yarn into any 3 ch sp, [3ch, 2 tr, 3 ch, 3 tr] in same ch sp, 1 ch, make 3 tr, 1 ch in each 1 ch sp to next 3 ch sp, [3 tr, 3 ch, 3 tr] in next 3 ch sp, 1 ch, contine to end of round, making [3 tr, 3 ch, 3 tr] in each 3 ch sp and 3 tr in each 1 ch sp, separating each tr cluster with 1 ch.

Repeat 4th rnd until work is required length.

Fasten off yarn and weave in ends.

Edging – Join new yarn to any ch sp.

Make 1 dc in each ch sp and top of each tr to first corner, 5 dc in 3 ch sp, continue around final rnd making 1 dc in each tr and ch sp, with 5 dc in each 3 ch sp to keep the corners square. Fasten off yarn. ■
