



# MAMA Fest is forced to cancel

## Fee for hire of venue 'significantly increased'

LOCHGILPHEAD'S biggest music festival, held on the first weekend in September, has had to be cancelled at the 11th hour after the owners of the venue significantly increased the rent and a change to regulations made the festival 'unworkable'.

Organisers of MAMA Fest, now in its third year, say the new owners of the Argyll Hotel had stepped in to allow a smaller event to go ahead, but bands had already been cancelled.

At the time of going to press discussions were ongoing with various venues and the group had considered other options to raise the cash to pay for the festival, but decided at this time to cancel the event for one year only.

The popular music festival has attracted

capacity crowds for the past two years.

Co-founder George Durnan, told *The Argyllshire Advertiser* that he and chairwoman Liz Perkins were 'extremely disappointed, but had no option but to cancel the festival'.

### Lots of money

Mr Durnan said: 'I feel that someone has looked at our website and thought, "oh they look like they have lots of money".'

'The fact is we don't have a lot of money. We are a small festival run by volunteers who put on an amazing experience of Argyll musicians for Lochgilphead people.

'We are committed to continuing to do that.

'There are very few events that take place in Lochgilphead

and we want to keep MAMA Fest in the town and part of an annual calendar.'

Mr Durnan explained the reason the festival needed to be cancelled was due to a change to the regulations for the use of the Drill Hall and a 'substantial' increase in the fee charge to hire the venue.

Mr Durnan said: 'It made it unfeasible.'

'The event has to pay for itself. With less than a month to go all the rules seem to have been changed.'

Councillor Dougie Philand, who has supported the event since it was conceived by Liz Perkins and George Durnan, said: 'I am disappointed that the group has been left in this position at the last minute.

'The regulations

placed at this time were too onerous and it meant taking the very difficult decision of cancelling the event.

'I am extremely disappointed for the volunteers who organise this tremendous festival, the bands, but

most of all the people of Lochgilphead.

'If the owners of the hall had given more warning, say nine or 10 months ago, we could have sorted this situation out. But to tell us less than 30 days before is simply unacceptable

and I will be writing to the Army Cadet Force in Dundee, who own the building.'

Ms Perkins asked anyone who wanted to offer support or had any questions about the event to get in contact with her.

## Bank of Scotland branch in Inveraray to close in November

WITH only three regular weekly customers, the Bank of Scotland in Inveraray has confirmed it will be closing its doors for good on November 3 after decades of service to the burgh.

A spokesman for the bank said it had made the decision after a reduced number of people were using the bank, preferring instead to go to Lochgilphead.

The spokesman said: 'We have made the difficult decision to close Inveraray branch. This branch has been identified for closure because of the changing way customers choose to bank with us, which has resulted in customers using it less often.

'The majority of customers also now regularly use alternative branches or use other ways to bank such as online and telephone banking to complete their banking needs.

'We apologise for any inconvenience that this may cause and have informed customers of the closest alternative branches.'

## Mid Argyll pupils' exam results arrive

Although many students were pleasantly surprised by the results, they disagree that exams are an accurate representation of a pupil's intelligence.

Diane Corr, aged 17, from Ardrishaig said: 'Your whole school year is based on one piece of paper. I don't think that's fair at all.'

Another Lochgilphead High School student said: 'The exams rely quite heavily on technique and the way you answer the questions, instead of the information that you understand.

'They also are so short, so if external factors like stress and illness are prominent then it can significantly alter your performance on the day.'

However, Milly Rogers, Deputy Head Girl at Lochgilphead High School, claimed: 'I don't think they show someone's intelligence but more how much they are willing to work and how much effort they put into ex-

ams - but obviously if you work harder you learn more.'

It's no secret the SQA have had a tough time this year with almost every exam they submitted in May having a petition started against it almost immediately

after students left the exam halls.

One student said: 'I think people saw the effect masses of people complaining had with the Higher Maths exam in 2015, where the pass mark was lowered significantly, and used it to their advantage this year to get the best chance of passing.'

# Mary moves into her new home

TODAY is a big day for the MacLean family of Inveraray.

Severely disabled mum Mary moves into her new home on Friday August 12 after months of worry over whether the purpose-built flat would be hers.

Mary MacLean was just 48 when she suffered a brain aneurism and stroke in December 2014.

## Care

She spent a year in hospital, getting home in time for Christmas last year, but now needs round-the-clock care.

This once fit and active woman was left in a house unsuitable for someone with her range of care needs.

Mary's family believed a solution had

been found through Argyll Community Housing Association (ACHA) when a home suited to Mary's needs was offered in a new Inveraray housing development.

But the family later discovered this flat had been allocated to another tenant.

## Campaign

At this point Mary's daughters, Megan and Rachel, along with dad Ally, began a campaign to help their mother and wife.

There was anger around Inveraray at the news and the campaign grew in strength.

After lengthy discussions with ACHA, elected representatives, Argyll and Bute Council's social work department and the family's existing landlord

Fyne Homes, ACHA offered the MacLeans a three-bedroom home in a proposed development in Inveraray. This was welcomed by Mary's family, but the house was yet to be built and her needs were pressing.

There was another twist when, in early July, the family allocated the home Mary had originally hoped to occupy pulled out,

leaving the way clear for ACHA to offer Mary the tenancy.

The keys were picked up last week and Ally and the family have been busy preparing the Tower View flat for Mary.

The new house has a purpose-built bedroom with easy access wetroom and the kitchen is designed for wheelchair users. There is also a bed-

room for Mary's carers.

'The new house is light years ahead of what we have at the moment for Mary,' explained a delighted Ally.

Mary was looking forward to moving into her new home, but admitted the prospect was 'a bit scary'.

## Freedom

Her husband added: 'She'll be fine once she gets used to it. She'll be able to use her electric wheelchair to move around from room to room. It will give her more freedom and should be a

lot more stimulating for her.'

Ally went on to praise their daughters: 'I want to say thanks to Megan and Rachel for keeping the pressure on over this and not giving up on their mum.'

Alastair MacGregor, ACHA chief executive, offered his own congratulations, saying: 'I am delighted Mary MacLean is able to be housed in the association's new development at Tower View.'

'I hope the new home meets Mary and her family's needs and I wish them all the very best for the future.'

## Overnight closures for Oban road

RESURFACING work on the A816 Oban to Lochgilphead road will mean the road being closed overnight later this month.

The road will be shut between the hours of 7pm and 6am, from Monday August 29 to Friday September 2, while resurfacing work is carried out between Kintraw and Salachary.

A diversion route via Inveraray will be in place, although access will be maintained

for emergency vehicles. Advance warning signs will be put up in Lochgilphead and Oban with roadblocks at the B8002 Ardfern junction and the B840 Ford junction.

There will be periods throughout the night when the road can be opened to allow traffic through under convoy but times cannot be guaranteed and there may be significant delays to anyone using this route.

## Older workers stay longer in jobs

FIGURES just released show 9.4 million workers aged over 50 are in employment, 3.7 million more than 20 years ago, according to the Department for Work and Pensions.

In 2015, 8.3 million older workers were in employment, 12.2 per cent higher than in 1995. Argyll follows the rest of the country in this trend.



# Public have their say on integrated joint board of NHS and the council

THE INTEGRATED Joint Board (IJB) of NHS Highland and Argyll and Bute Council has come into sharp focus this week after it decided to close down two nursing homes in Argyll.

But do people know what it is? Junior reporter Niamh Adams

McGilp went out and about on the streets of Lochgilphead to find out if people were aware of the changes.

Niamh asked whether people were aware of the IJB, and if so what they thought of it, and what people's biggest concern over health care was at present.

Shirley Nicolson, Lochgilphead, knew what the IJB was and thought 'them being together makes less room for a loss in communication.'

She said: 'I'd say the biggest issue at the moment is not having enough speciality nurses.'

'It's not fair making elderly people travel to Glasgow to see a

speciality nurse. There should be more employed here, maybe even a clinic.'

Fiona Wallace, Lochgilphead, said: 'I think in principle the idea works but in practice it is going to take longer and be more complex than anticipated.'

'I can honestly say

I have had no issues, no negative experiences with the current system.'

While Malcolm Northcote, Lochgilphead, didn't know what the IJB was he said: 'I think it's a good idea so each department knows what they're doing individually and with the others.'

'We're lucky enough that we don't really have to use them. The children do sometimes, but we don't really need to see the doctor that often. However, there are a lot of old people in need of care. The resources are extremely stretched at the moment.'

'A couple of years ago my elderly mother was in need of emergency treatment and had to wait for hours, although that was in a Glasgow hospital, so I understand they're extremely busy. In general, the waiting times are the biggest issue.'

Jamie MacFarlane from Mid Argyll said he didn't know about the IJB.

He said: 'I don't

know enough about it to have a proper opinion. I like to read about these things first.'

'It seems like a good idea because things can get a bit lost in communication between the services and having them joint might resolve the issues.'

'The biggest issue for me is waiting times for appointments. Apart from that I'd say it's okay.'

While Patricia Watkins from Lochgilphead didn't know about the IJB, she thought it was a good idea to get people together. She said: 'If they're all under one roof they'll probably be able to communicate better.'

'Waiting times are probably the biggest issue for me. You get good treatment but you could book in at the doctor and wait 35 minutes before they see you. You could be in the hospital at 10am and not be seen until 11am. Just the delays really.'

'I can't really complain, I'm not paying for it. Not up front anyway.'

Avril Lockhart from Mid Argyll didn't know what the IJB was. She said: 'Hopefully they'll be able to co-ordinate services better. Having worked in social services before, I know what it's like.'

'Hopefully they'll be able to manage spending budgets better if they're working together.'

'I'd say the main issue is lack of funding. There's not enough services for the people who need them.'

Wilma Meikle from Lochgilphead said: 'In theory, I think it's a good idea, but I'm not sure about how it would work in prac-

tice. 'I'd imagine you'd get a better overview and better communication if everyone's under one umbrella, but in practice it's not always as easy.'

'I personally don't have any problems, but you hear a lot about people struggling to get care for their elderly parents.'

'I think that's a big problem.'

THE LACK of understanding of what has happened with the health care system in Argyll and Bute is only beginning to hit home.

Many people don't know what the Integrated Joint Board (IJB) is and others certainly don't know just how big its budget is.

But it was agreed at many council meetings that this was the way forward - there were very few voices, if any, speaking otherwise.

All of a sudden a decision is made to close care homes and we want to know who is responsible for the decision.

It was only a few years ago that people protested so much over the closure of Struan Lodge in Dunoon that the council had to make a U-turn.

But now that proposals to close Struan Lodge and other elderly residential homes are back on the table, there seems to be a breakdown in accountability. They will close - because it is hard to fight against a faceless committee rather than badger your local elected member.

Everyone who knew about the IJB merger between NHS Highland and Argyll and Bute Council was carried along with the thought of social work, health and care working together. It makes financial and staffing sense not to double up.

And somewhere - without any election being held - it was decided the main features would stay would be under health. We don't elect people to health boards - they are now nominated and appointed on the most part. We do elect our councillors.

Therefore we have lost something in the accountability of the health sector of social care.

Is this the thin end of the wedge? Are we now at the point of no return? Can we claim back some people power in this situation?

As Argyll and Bute was one of the first health care partnerships under an integrated joint board, the path is not clear.

But one thing is for sure. We used to be able to deselect people who made poor choices for our communities. Who know how we will make sure we get what we want in the future?

# Have your say on Crinan Canal pricing

'Invariably, as a result of this exercise, some customers will see prices rise while other will see them fall'

BOATERS are to have their say on pricing on the Crinan Canal.

In April 2015, Scottish Canals introduced a price increase in mooring and licence fees, leading to complaints that the higher charges were not applied on a fair basis.

A consultation which sets out a long-term pricing plan for living and travelling on Scotland's canals has now been published, following an independent review.

Canal users are being asked to have their say on the document.

## Review

Property consultants Gerald Eve and GVA, with support from British Marine and Royal Yachting Association Scotland, carried out an independent review of the price of leisure and residential moorings, as well as the cost of navigation and transit licences.

As well as assessing the amenities, attractiveness, location and accesses of each leisure and residen-

tial site, the review also compared the price residential moorings to the cost of an equivalent land-based, two-bedroom dwelling in the same area.

The subsequent report includes a plan for setting the market price of all residential and leisure moorings and licences on Scotland's canals, as well as a clear framework for implementing future price changes.

Steve Dunlop, chief executive of Scottish Canals, said: 'Scotland's canals attract 22 million visits per year from walkers, cyclists, anglers, paddlers, residents and boaters. All the income we generate from the products and services we provide is reinvested in these valuable heritage assets so locals and visitors can continue to enjoy them for many years to come.'

'As a public body, we have a responsibility to ensure we adopt a fair and reasonable approach to pricing which benefits all

our customers, not just a few. With varying amenities and customer demand, however, between not only the canals but locations on each waterway, inconsistencies in pricing have developed over the years and some of our boating customers have ended up paying more than others for the same product.

## Benchmark

'Invariably, as a result of this exercise, some customers will see prices rise while other will see them fall. This independent review, however, sets a benchmark for fair, reasonable and transparent pricing going forward and I would encourage as many people as possible to respond to the consultation on how the recommendations are implemented.'



The celebration was scheduled to last all day and despite miserable weather forcing an early finish, it attracted and entertained
