

# £2.5 million fishing vessel launched

A NAVAL architect with more than a quarter of a century's experience has seen his latest design slip into the water.

Ian Paton, 55, of Campbeltown-based S C McAllister, who now works from the company's York office, said that the Resilient, on sea trials last week, built by his yard Parkol in Whitby is just the sort of traditional fishing vessel he learned to design at Campbeltown shipyard.

It was virtually a double celebration for Mr Paton as his Kintyre-born wife, Alison, gave birth to his first child, Florence Isabella, named after her grandmother, just three months ago.

**Naval architect**  
Mr Paton trained as a naval architect at Strathclyde University and first joined defence contractors Vickers on the Clyde before moving to Campbeltown Shipyard in 1989.

Mr Paton said: 'The


shipyard employed skilled tradesmen, it was all under cover, materials were shipped in and everything was made in house.

'The truth is that this is a boat which could have been built at the shipyard if it was still in business.'

Mr Paton was paid off from the shipyard in 1994 and taken on by Stewart McAllister, of S C McAllister, almost straight away moving up the road to his High Askomil office. After 11 years, in 2005, he moved again to the firm's York office.

'I have boats built in various places and Parkol, of which I am a director, is currently working on a 24-metre boat for Fraserburgh and a 26-metre boat which will be Whitby based,' added Mr Paton.

skipped by Arthur Polson and crew. She is described as a seiner/trawler, with a new design of seine nets, which Mr Paton says is a more passive way of fishing.

Resilient is also designed to be highly fuel efficient with a Mitsubishi main engine coupled to a Fin-

noy 10.75:1 reduction gearbox and 2700mm diameter CP propeller turning in a custom designed nozzle.

Mr Paton does not restrict his work to fishing vessels and for 10 years has worked on a luxury motor yacht design. That boat, based on the lines of a tug, to be named Able One of

Whitby will shortly be launched.

The Resilient joins two other S C McAllister boats launched this year; Golden Shore B42 at Mooney Boats, Killybegs, Republic of Ireland and Sean Og, for Jonathan O'Donnell, at Borth Ceredigion, South Wales.

# Callouts for Campbeltown lifeboat

THE WEE Toon's lifeboat crew played a vital role in two rescues and helped with a pair of other incidents.

On Wednesday last week, the crew were called out when fishing boat *Perseverance* started to sink in the harbour.

The lifeboat had to leave that incident to help at a rescue 7.3 miles north-west of Ailsa Craig.

There a Romanian fisherman from the Northern Irish-owned fishing vessel *Sea Harvester* had been hurt in

an accident. The crewman was taken to a hospital in Glasgow, where he is on life support, with what are described as serious head injuries.

*Sea Harvester* was moored at Campbeltown and the crew accommodated, with help from the Fishermen's Mission, at the bunkhouse. A representative from the UK government's Marine Accident Investigation Branch (MAIB) began an investigation into the cause of the accident.

The MAIB's role is to investigate marine accidents involving UK vessels worldwide and all vessels in UK territorial waters.

Its job is to help prevent further avoidable accidents, but not to establish blame or liability.

Three days later the lifeboat was in action again when the skipper of a 38ft sailing yacht, *Katrilli*, got into difficulties in a force six wind near Sanda Island.

An RNLI spokesperson said: 'There were three people on board and we took a four-year-old boy and a

woman back to Campbeltown. A crew member, who is a good sailor, helped the owner

bring the yacht back to Campbeltown.'

While at this incident the lifeboat was

called out to a sinking speedboat near Ailsa Craig where five men on board had just three

life jackets. They were rescued by helicopter before the Campbeltown lifeboat arrived.

# Frustration for airline passengers

AN AIRLINE'S frustrated passengers were shunted from plane to plane before a fog-bound flight was aborted.

The Flybe flight, operated by Loganair, from Glasgow to Campbeltown on Wednesday last week was scheduled to depart at 4.25pm. One passenger, who later spoke to *The Courier*, arrived at 3.15pm.

After a 35-minute delay, passengers finally boarded a Twin Otter aircraft at 5pm.

Twenty minutes later they were told the aircraft would not be taking off. A pilot said European flying hour regulations meant he was unable to fly.

Because of adverse weather conditions and their impact on other flights, no relief pilot was available immediately and travellers were instructed to await further information.

Menzies Aviation crew were not aware the flight had been cancelled and told passen-

gers this information was false.

Staff told confused passengers that a different aircraft would be taking them to Campbeltown.

After another wait, passengers boarded an aircraft which took off at approximately 7pm.

Around 20 minutes into the flight passengers noticed the landing gear emerging before retracting again.

The landing gear made another appearance, before the engines revved and an upward thrust was felt.

Passengers were left confused, the more

nervous flyers amongst them very fearful. A pilot told passengers that the weather in Campbeltown had deteriorated whilst they were airborne and as landing was impossible, the plane would be forced to return to Glasgow.

The stranded travellers were offered overnight accommodation if they wished to travel on the Thursday morning flight, a refund, or travel by road that evening.

Transport across Glasgow was not provided and city residents who wished to return home were forced to

make their own way. One passenger, who preferred not to be named, said: 'I'd never use this service again.'

'At the end of that horrendous day all I wanted to do was return to my flat in Glasgow, but they refused to pay for my taxi.'

'I understand the weather is out of their hands, but the way they handled the situation was appalling.'

A spokesperson from Loganair said: 'Loganair's services to Islay, Campbeltown and Tiree were all disrupted by adverse weather conditions affecting

the region on the afternoon of August 3. Six people were accommodated overnight. Each was provided with dinner, bed and breakfast before travelling early the following day.

'Ultimately this situ-

ation arose due to extremely challenging weather conditions and no pilot would attempt to land if the approach was deemed unsafe.

'We apologise to our customers for the inconvenience.'

## Mobile crane crew refloats boat

CAMPBELTOWN lifeboat did not have far to go when a fishing boat sank in the harbour.

CN17 *Perseverance*, owned by crew member Don Hardman, went down on Wednesday afternoon last week. The lifeboat attended at 4.20pm but was called away to a serious incident offshore an hour later.

The next morning a mobile crane supplied by McFadyens was set up on the quay by its operator Sandy McNaughton.

A boom was placed round the area where the boat went down to contain any fuel oil leaking from the tanks.

Frogman Jimmy McAllister put canvas strops round the boat's hull, under the water. These were connected to chains and the crane's hook.

When the lifting operation started, the boat was lifted a bit at a time until the superstructure was out of the water and a man could get on deck.

A pump, set up on the quay, removed the remaining water once the hull was secure. Later the boat was hauled from the harbour and transported to the new quay.

As *The Courier* went to press, the cause of the incident was unknown.



'It is a great life bringing a family up on a farm.'

In no time more water was coming in than could be removed and the vessel was sinking.

With just three lifejackets on board, it could have been perilous if a coastguard helicopter had not arrived, in the nick of time, as the boat sank.

# Dozen artists banged up in Victorian cells

A DOZEN artists will spend five days on bread and water in the Wee Toon's former police station jail.

During MOK Fest next week, from Wednesday to Sunday, the derelict Castlehill building will be transformed.

One of the artists, Helena Koumbouzis, bases her work on the childhood memories of her father-in-law, who lived in the Campbeltown prison as a child when his father was the custody officer there.

She has commissioned two wooden sculptures by the Glasgow social chari-

ty GalGael that reflect imprisonment from a child's point of view.

The show is curated by Rhona Taylor who studied painting at Edinburgh College of Art, and now works from a studio in the city as well as at Edinburgh Printmakers. Rhona is particularly interested in making work for non-conventional gallery spaces and has held exhibitions and installations in hospitals, libraries, a cinema, a Second World War boat shed – and now a former prison.

The venue was built as a prison in 1847,

designed by the Edinburgh architect Thomas Brown. It was also used as the town's police station until 2009, when the police moved into new premises, and it has not been opened to the public since.

Confined Spaces includes a film installation by Ben Skea, sculpture by Edwina Bracken, drawing and sculpture by Kari Stewart, and a sound installation by Kim Walker.

Frankie Burr is installing an interactive, site-specific sculpture, and Devin Wallace will be bringing his take on celebrity culture into the cells with a large-scale wall painting.



# Campbeltown author's book reveals Kintyre's scenic corners

## A Third Summer in Kintyre by Angus Martin is on sale now

THE FINAL instalment of a Campbeltown author's trilogy is a very personal wander through the region's byways and contemporary folklore.

Part autobiography, history and natural history, Angus Martin's latest paperback: *A Third Summer in Kintyre* begins on April 1 at Ben Gullion and finishes at Lagloskin on September 15.

It is his second publication this year the first being a book of poetry: *A Night of Islands* published by Shoe-string Press in February. That saw a revival of interest in Martin's

poems and invitations to speak at two poetry festivals.

His five-and-a-half months, in this latest book, are filled with walking, cycling and, when he is lucky enough to be offered a lift, car borne expeditions around the region.

These excursions form the basis for a discussion of the area's fauna, flora and characters as well as trips down memory lane, amply illustrated with Martin's black-and-white photographs.


A quick scan of the index is intriguing in itself. Heinrich Har-

rer's classic account of the first ascent of the Eiger Nordwand is referenced, as is rock musician Steve Winwood and even Marilyn Monroe.

The book though is not about those who have found fame in the world and Kintyre people form the bulk of the stories. It is a great yarn and there is plenty to interest anyone, whether a native or visitor. One of the first indexed sections is adders and there is a fascinating story about two of Martin's childhood pals' reptilian encounter.

More than six pages are devoted to an Israeli journalist, Jon Immanuel. Last year, guided by Martin, he visited the site where, the uncle he never knew, died in a 1941 air crash.

Martin says that the story began with a letter in *The Courier* on

July 10, in fact the correspondence had been on-going since 2009 and after nearly 20 emails last year, Mr Immanuel finally decided to come to Kintyre.


Martin's story of that trip digs up some unusual war time history which is starting to fade from living memory. Martin's research

is exemplary and the book includes nearly six pages of references to his original sources.

This book should be on the shelf of any reader who loves Kintyre and its unique landscape. Although not intended as a guidebook it provides plenty of inspiration for travel to the peninsula's lesser known parts.







### TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO AUGUST 16 1991

We are the Mugwumps!

MUGWUMPS was the group title of children taking part in a successful trial venture last week by the new minister of the Highland church, Campbeltown, to revive youth work in the parish.

An average of 40 children aged eight to 13 attended team games in Kirk Street church hall from Monday to Friday on the theme of Christ, the light of the world, and the Mugwump.

The Mugwump is a character of Australian children's fiction – a bird that cannot make up its mind and sits on the fence with his mug in one direction and his wump in the other.

The week ended with a barbecue for the children in the grounds of the Highland church on Saturday and a family service in church on Sunday morning.

### FIFTY YEARS AGO AUGUST 11 1966

Youngsters' good idea

CAMPBELTOWN'S young entertainment officers, Mhairiad McKiven and William Crossan, have found a way to beat the ban on small boats ferrying people to Davaar Island to see the cave picture and the lighthouse.

They have been organising expeditions on foot to cross the Dhorlinn at low water. On last week's first trip more than 40 visitors went along. To make things easier the youngsters organised a bus for the journey to Kildalloig.

The lighthouse-keepers have co-operated in showing the parties round and a number of very satisfied holiday-makers have had a glorious afternoon on Davaar.

The experiment is certainly to be repeated. As the young officers remarked, it is a pity that the idea was not thought of earlier.

### ONE HUNDRED YEARS AGO AUGUST 12 1916

Fire at hotel stables

SHORTLY after mid-day on Tuesday fire was discovered to have broken out in the harness room in connection with

the stables of Mr Archd. Johnston, Royal Hotel.

Dense volumes of smoke were observed issuing from the premises, and precautionary steps were at once taken to save valuable plant by the removal from the adjoining garage of two motor cars and a hearse, which were taken out into the yard – a task not easy of accomplishment owing to the belching and suffocating smoke.

The alarm was immediately raised, and the town fire house, under the superintendence of Mr James M'Callum, firemaster, was promptly on the scene.

By this time the flames had got a hold on one side of the harness room, and were quickly spreading through the roof. The hose was introduced through a window at the rear of the premises, and a copious supply of water being brought to bear on the woodwork, the outbreak was soon checked.


