

Michael Bolton, Robin Gibb of the Bee Gees, Natasha Hamilton and Liz McEarnon from Atomic Kitten, Lee Mead of reality show Joseph, Mica Paris and Hayley Westenrau to name a few.

Neil and three other pipers and two drummers from the battalion were invited to Abbey Road studios to record the single *We Will Remember Them* for the charity Help the Heroes (The Royal British Legion).

Neil was brought up in Campbeltown and attended Campbeltown Grammar School. He began piping when he was

eight and he was a pupil of the late Pipe Major Tony Wilson and was a member of Kintyre and District Pipe Band.

Neil has won many major competitions including the Burgh Cup at Cowal.

We Will Remember Them was released digitally on Sunday November 8. The CD will be released on Sunday November 29 and will raise money for Help For Heroes and The Royal British Legion this Christmas time.

Neil is on attachment from Germany teaching piping at the Army Royal Regimental School Of Piping Edinburgh Castle until May 2010 when he is due to go to Afghanistan; he completed a six month tour in Iraq from June to Dec 2008.

He joined the regular army in 2000 from the TA.

Victim's £1,000 compensation

A CAMPBELTOWN man was assaulted and left semi-conscious in a family feud.

Christopher McLellan, aged 23, of 6 Castlehill Court, Campbeltown, admitted assaulting a member of his extended family and severely injuring him on Kirk Street, on May 10, when he appeared before the town's sheriff court last week.

He and his victim happened to meet in a pub,

both had been drinking and they went outside 'to resolve the matter' said depute fiscal Kelly Duling; the other man ended up with a broken cheekbone.

In McLellan's defence it was said that incident happened against a background of years of bad feeling within the paternal side of his family.

Sheriff Ruth Anderson QC said she was concerned that McLellan

had continued to punch his victim when he was on the floor and left him in 'a state of semi-consciousness'.

She ordered McLellan to undertake 250 hours on unpaid work in the community and pay £1,000 to his victim in compensation.

The sheriff told McLellan: 'Apart from this you have been a hard working and law abiding member of this community.'

Woman to fight ASBO claims

A59-YEAR-old woman is challenging two Anti Social Behaviour Orders, which were granted ad interim against her.

Argyll Community Housing Association was

granted two ASBOS ad interim at Campbeltown Sheriff Court on October 14 by Sheriff Ruth Anderson QC who heard allegations that one of its tenants, Mrs Ann Walton was abusive to neighbours and that the way she fed wild birds at her home at Castleacres, Campbeltown, attracted large numbers of seagulls.

The case was again before the court on Friday November 13 when Mrs Walton was not present but her solicitor said she intended to defend the action.

The case was sisted for Mrs Waltons legal aid application to be determined and the ad interim orders were continued.

Tentative talks on tender for ferry

KINTYRE has an early Christmas present with news of moves both sides of the North Channel to get the Campbeltown-Ballycastle ferry back on course.

Argyll and Bute Council announced this week that leader Dick Walsh and Sally Loudon, chief executive, had held 'a successful meeting' with Cara McShane and Richard Lewis, their respective counterparts, on Moyle District Council as well as Arlene Fos-

ter, the Northern Ireland Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Investment. They have now agreed to develop tender documents for the route early in the New Year.

Councillor John Semple, who chairs the Kintyre Initiative Working Group said: 'As someone who has campaigned for more than 10 years - this is one reason why I stood to be a councillor. We have commitment for the ferry on our side and it's good to see

we've got commitment from the Irish side.'

But MP for Argyll and Bute Alan Reid called for action now. 'I am frustrated at the broken promises, spin and lack of action from this SNP Government,' said Mr Reid. 'Tender documents were drawn up years ago.'

'There is no good reason for waiting until next year for a meeting to talk about it.'



Mouth cancer - a trip to the library could save your life

NEXT week take one of the most important visits you'll ever make to Campbeltown Library at Aqualibrium – it could save your life.

Caroline Glen, oral health educator will be holding a four-day event to tell people about mouth cancer.

Mouth cancer is on the increase and hitting more young people. It is as common as prostate or cervical cancer but many people are unaware of the

disease and its symptoms. Caroline will be available to offer advice and tell people more about mouth cancer, its common causes and its detection and treatment.

Mouth Screenings

She will be in the community room at the library from Tuesday 24 to Friday November 27. On Thursday 26 Richard Singleton, a dental officer, will join Caroline to carry out mouth screenings for anyone

worried about any red or white patches, non-healing ulcers or lumps that have been present for more than two or three weeks.

Most importantly the campaign's slogan is 'If in doubt check it out' and advice will be given on how to self-examine and what to look for.

Caroline who is employed by the Argyll and Bute community Health Partnership, said: 'Three-quarters of cases are linked to tobacco and alcohol.'

Golf course to close for winter work

Some course staff laid off, but restaurant and cottages stay open

MACHRIHANISH Dunes Golf Course this week laid off up to seven people while remodelling work takes place over the winter months on the course, which opened this year.

General manager Kevin Lewis told The Courier that between six or seven posts at the club were affected by the work on the golf course; there would be jobs again when the course reopens.

Owners Southworth Development announced it would be undertaking a series of routine course modifications over the winter months.

Greg Sherwood, president of Southworth Golf said: 'We have received overwhelmingly positive feedback on the golf course but we will always continue to look for ways to enhance it. There were a couple areas that we felt we could change in order to make the course even more enjoyable for the average player.'

The Old Club House restaurant and the luxury Ugadale Cottages owned by Machrihanish Dunes Golf Club are not affected by the course closure and would remain open as normal throughout.

Specifically, the course's 8th green will be moved closer to the fairway, shortening the hole and reducing the carry required to

reach the green. That change will also allow the location of the second tee to be shifted inland, a point from which the fairway will be more visible from the tee. The 9th fairway will also be widened a bit, which will help both on tee shots as well as making the approach to the green more straightforward. Finally, work will also be done to reduce the severity of specific areas of the secondary rough.

In order to complete the work with the least impact on course availability possible, Southworth has decided to close the course for a period of time, work is expected to

begin in January and be finished by the end of March.

'Closing the course for any period of time is not an easy decision to make,' Mr Sherwood said. 'But it's consistent with the kind of experience we want to provide visiting golfers. It's typical for new courses to undergo slight changes in the months after they open, based on what we learn about how the course plays in its first season. We're glad to be in a position to be able to effect these changes in such a timely way, because we know that in the end, visitors to this course will enjoy it all the more as a result.'

Road blocks in drugs fight

More than 100 vehicles stopped at Inveraray

POLICE in Mid Argyll and Kintyre are drawing together all their resources to stop drugs coming into the area.

Anyone travelling through Inveraray on Friday November 6 would have noticed the heavy police presence.

Officers from the Mid Argyll and South Kintyre community policing teams joined forces with the primary aim of disrupting the sale and supply of drugs within the area.

During the evening a total of 142 vehicles were stopped, with six people detected for road traffic offences and one person was charged with possession of controlled drugs.

Officers were assisted by Strathclyde Police's road policing department and dog branch.

The operation involved

a static roadblock set up in Inveraray where all vehicles, including the service buses, were stopped.

Vehicles were examined by road policing officers and where grounds existed, vehicles and their occupants were searched for controlled substances.

Chief Inspector Marlene Baillie, who led the operation, explained:

'This is part of an ongoing strategy to prevent controlled drugs from coming into our communities, via the roads network.'

'Such road blocks will continue to be set up at strategic points over the next few months with a view to detecting traveling criminals operating in the area, disrupting the activities of those involved in

drug dealing or supply, detecting road traffic offences and providing public reassurance by the increased visibility of police officers.'

The tactics being deployed by police include using plain-clothed officers, the Automatic Number Plate Recognition vehicle, which identifies vehicles of particular interest to the police, and drugs dogs.

YOUNGSTERS from Lochgilphead and Tarbert have enjoyed receiving their education outdoors for the past few weeks.

Pupils from Lochgilphead High School and Tarbert Academy have been working in partnership with the Lochgilphead MCMC Group to fund and support a Forest School Programme.

Based on a Scandinavian idea, Forest Schools has been growing in popularity in Scotland.

Youngsters are taken by trained staff to an area of woodland for half a day over a period of at least nine weeks and participate in a variety of activities that will develop, among other things, practical skills, team work and confidence.

Currently the participants in Lochgilphead are creating a shelter and simple seats for the Forest Schools site.

Free meeting on BVD in Campbeltown

BOVINE Virus Diarrhoea (BVD) Virus is extremely infectious and can cause abortion, infertility and poor performance in herds.

Worryingly, it is thought that BVD is present in 90 per cent of UK dairy and beef herds.

To bring farmers and their vets the latest information about what is known about this health

problem, as well as giving practical advice on the control strategies currently available, a free meeting has been organised at the Ardshiel Hotel in Campbeltown on Monday November 23.

During this meeting Dr Peter Nettleton, senior veterinary virologist at Moredun will outline the principal signs of the disease and how it

spreads before describing some of the control and prevention principals available in relation to the main cattle production systems, including vaccination and cattle health schemes.

Dr Nettleton is keen to stress the impact BVD can have on herds. He said: 'Although BVD can result in diarrhoea, the main disease occurs when the virus infects

susceptible pregnant cows. This can either result in the unborn calves dying, or being born persistently infected (PI) with the virus.'

He added: 'BVD infection is spread and maintained through the existence of these PI animals, which constantly excrete the virus and infect other cattle that are in close contact. Control and prevention

of the infection can only be achieved by applying strict biosecurity procedures, vaccination and long term control strategies.'

He will be joined by vet Donald Armour from Cousin Buchanan and Armour vet practice in Campbeltown, who will highlight the problem of BVD in the local area.

This free animal health meeting has been

organised by Moredun, a world leader in research into the health and welfare of livestock and is part of a National Animal Health Roadshow.

The meeting will be chaired by Archie McArthur, of Ormsary, and will begin at 7.30pm. Admission is free and open to all. For further information contact Maggie Bennett on 0131 445 5111.

6,000gns heifer comes to Kintyre

THE BREED record average for milkers was smashed when one of the finest herds of dairy cattle ever to grace Carlisle's Borderway Mart was dispersed on Wednesday November 4 with a 6000gns heifer coming to a Kintyre farm.

The Barr herd of pedigree Ayrshires established in 1919, was the oldest registered herd in existence today and had always been in the Kirkpatrick family's expert hands.

Over the past 30 years the herd has won no less than 92 National and Local Breed Championships with animals from some the red and white breeds most sought after families.

J&M Barr of Clochkeil bought the VG88 July calved heifer, one of three big time show daughters of the EX94 Barr Retrospective.

One of the auctioneers involved with the sale, Edward Brown, said that he and his colleagues at Harrison and Hetherington were privileged to be associated with the sale

and it had been enlightening to be confronted by so many wonderful animals, superbly bred and skilfully managed.

'We are not surprised that the breed record average for milkers was broken. This herd deserved to do it,' he said. It is unusual for the older cows in dispersal to feature amongst the leading prices but this was a trend of the sale and reflected the wear ability in the breeding.

Thomas Cameron of Gartvaigh and James Barbour of Machribeg also bought at the auction.





The main fear among community councillors was that the paintings had been taken for good, and that in time the fact that they were Campbeltown property would be forgotten.

CHILDREN at St Kieran's Catholic School in Campbeltown added their contribution to the Save the Children Fund Ethiopian Appeal on Friday with an afternoon bring and buy sale.

And having brought along hundreds of toys and games, books, magazines and comics – as well as cake and candy made by mums and the youngsters themselves – there was some hectic selling.

The school's 50 children were very enthusiastic about the effort and they raised 360 between them from the sale.

Final footage shot for White Nights

The closing stages of the shooting done at RAF Machrihanish for the Columbia film *White Nights* have been taking place over the past three weeks and the cameras finally came to a halt on Friday.

The airborne scenes with a Boeing 747 in decorative green and white were the main feature of the filming, with a Lear twin-engine jet, the type of executive jet popular with millionaires – flying alongside the Boeing.

It was in the air that the simulated crash landing approach was shot, but high up in the sky rather than close to the runway. The Boeing was filmed descending rockily through a cloud layer.

An identical baby brother of the 747 was used for the ground shots, with a Boeing 707 dressed in the same livery, but much smaller, careering off the runway into a radar tower.

The pilots for the action aircraft shots were Irishmen on loan from Aer Lingus, with two pilots, two engineers and a helicopter pilot making up the contingent that stayed at the Ardshiel.

The finished product of *White Nights* will not be on show for another year or more.



Down Memory Lane . . .

MAIN Street, Campbeltown, a century apart and what a different the internal combustion engine has made to the scene!

Campbeltown in Days Gone By from Carol McNeill gives a glimpse of what Campbeltown looked like a century ago, using images from two brothers who had a passion for photography. Charles and Dennis MacGrory photographed people, buildings, landscapes and a whole way of life, which have all long disappeared.

In their spare time between 1890 and 1914 they pursued their hobby. The brothers were active members of St Kieran's Church, served with the Volunteers, the Territorial Army of the day, and both served as local councillors.

The MacGrory Collection of around 3,000 images stored on

quarter-and-half-plate glass negatives, stereoscopes and lantern slides, was donated to Argyll and Bute Library Service, which has gradually catalogued, printed and digitised this legacy.

Carol McNeill, author and local historian, has selected 70 of the images and added explanatory captions. These include fishermen at their nets, farm workers, shopkeepers, coachmen and track-layers for the narrow-gauge railway, as well as the people of Campbeltown going about the business of their everyday lives.

The book gives a flavour of how Campbeltown looked in the early 1900s and captures a long-gone lifestyle in Victorian and Edwardian times. Carol née Burgess was born in Campbeltown and was a pupil at the Grammar School.





The Pupils survived a late scare when a far-post cross was headed onto the top of the crossbar.

A better performance from the Pupils in the second-half secured victory, although, it was obvious the result would have come much earlier if ruthlessness was added to the home side's game.
